What will happen to the information that we provide on the survey?

Once all of the surveys have been returned, we will tabulate the responses and provide each Lay Cistercian Community with a summary of the information that has been gathered. The summaries will also be available on our web site.

While this information will be used to plan the 2011 International Lay Cistercian Encounter, we feel it will also provide individual Communities with a means of identifying resources, ideas and strategies they will be able to use with their own formation programs.

What is the time frame for completing the survey?

October 8, 2008: Surveys are distributed to all of the Lay Communities
February 27, 2009: Surveys are returned no later than this date to the Coordinating Committee
April 24, 2009: Coordinating Committee members complete the summary of the surveys returned to them.
May 8, 2009: Summaries of the survey from each of the language groups will be published on the web site.

Use extra space to complete the survey if necessary. After you complete the survey, save the file with a new name such as "New Melleray Survey" or "Tarrawarra Survey", etc. Send the completed survey to the member of the Coordinating Committee representing your language group.
